

## **September 2017: Meeting notes**

The Each Home Counts Implementation Board held their monthly meeting on 12th September. The focus of this meeting was to discuss progress with shaping the quality mark and also the potential alignment of the quality mark with the government's Energy Company Obligation (ECO) scheme.

A quality mark subcommittee has been set up by the Implementation Board to review the proposed quality mark model being developed by industry and discuss how it may be established. There have been several subcommittee meetings to date and the group presented their initial findings to the Implementation Board on Tuesday.

At the board meeting, members agreed with the proposed quality mark model with further detail to be developed around consumer protection and enforcement. The subcommittee will continue to meet until October when they will present their final findings to the board on the delivery approach for the quality mark.

The work on the quality mark model, workstream lead Simon Ayers, will continue to be taken forward in parallel to the further subcommittee discussions around the delivery of the model.

The timelines for working towards the ECO scheme that is planned for October 2018 were also presented to the board. The workstream leads will now look at how the Each Home Counts recommendations that are a high priority for ECO can be delivered.

### **Actions:**

- Subcommittee to engage with BEIS & industry experts and prepare a final confidential proposal with a clear set of recommendations to be circulated to the board members by 28 Sept and presented at the at 5<sup>th</sup> October implementation board meeting.
- A clear plan of what the Quality Mark includes relevant to ECO is required by Dec 2017
